



Scissortails At Your Service


At the heart of the Lively Hotel's reception desk, guests can see Scissortails At Your Service, a 24-inch-tall polished bronze sculpture that delicately upholds the lower tier of the desk. The subtle-yet-impactful piece features three scissortailed flycatcher birds with outturned heads and swept-back wings, forming a circular, cylindrical shape. The sculpture seamlessly blends artistry and function, embodying the warm welcome and approachable elegance of the hotel.





The design of this piece, inspired by Oklahoma's state bird, began with pencil sketches and progressed through 3D rendering, full-scale clay sculpting, molding, and lost-wax casting in bronze followed by meticulous hand polishing. The final design incorporates a circular glass top, allowing viewers access to the "ariel" view.





Reckless Ride with Pretty Boy Bob






Embedded into the lobby wall near the floor, above baseboard, guests can find Reckless Ride with Pretty Boy Bob, a charming 4-inch-tall bronze mouse sculpture. Inspired by Beverly Cleary's book The Mouse And The Motorcycle, this sculpture depicts a mouse zooming out of the hotel lobby wall, racing to get somewhere – anywhere – fast. *Pretty Boy Bob* embodies the friendly energetic spirit of Oklahoma's "sooner" mentality, living as a pocket-sized mouse determined to meet all the hotel's guest. Home is Where You Hang Your Hat

Find the bronze hat sculpture inspired by the cowboy straw hat often worn by sculptor, painter, and Chiricahua Apache, Allan Houser, Born in 1914 on a farm near Apache, OK, Houser was inducted into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame in 1985 and became the first American Indian to receive the National Medal of Arts in 1992. Houser's hat, hanging in the Lively Hotel, serves as a gentle reminder to guests to look for the rest of the story-and certainly, feel at home during their stay in Oklahoma City.











Soaring Scissortail

Located in the Lively Hotel's dining room, *Soaring Scissortail* embodies optimism and aspiration. The elegant bird, with absurdly long tail, emerges from lostwax cast bronze. The 5-foot by 5-foot bas-relief sculpture weighs 255 pounds and is made to last thousands of years. What will viewers in the year 2424 think?



Pay It Forward

Pay It Forward is an installation of life-sized scissortail flycatcher feathers suspended from the ceiling in Cloud Puncher Bar and Restaurant. Each feather was first hand sculpted in clay and then shaped to appear as though floating in the air. Some believe that finding a feather brings luck, which led the artists to reflect on the balance between the delicacy and durability of feathers – and how words can be the same way. The toast below was written as the artwork was sculpted.

Cowboy Dreams aka A Job Well Done



After wrangling clouds, this cowboy enjoys a well-deserved rest, serving as a testament to the value of hard work and dreams fulfilled. This peaceful sculpture strikes an appropriate tone for guests who want a good night's rest in Oklahoma City. The journey of Cowboy Dreams began with a playful watercolor painting, which was then hand-sculpted in clay before being realized in its final form - bronze and white marble.
